



Stewards Rejoice

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ for you". 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18

The third Sunday of Advent is celebrated as JOY Sunday. Last Sunday we lit the third candle that symbolizes joy and is called the "Shepherd's Candle". To the shepherd's great joy, the angels announced that Jesus came from humble, unimportant people like them. In liturgy, the color rose signifies joy. This candle is colored pink to represent joyfulness and rejoicing.

The third Sunday also marks the half-way point of the season; two weeks behind us, and two weeks ahead. In other years, "crunch time" is usually filled with preparations: choir, special music, visits to shut-ins, in person study groups, decorations, children's program, Christmas Eve plans, etc. But this year, COVID concerns have changed many of our norms. Yet this church, our church, continues to witness the light of Christ with everything we have done. So, as we seek other ways to witness our God of Light, let's renew our joy to continue to live as grateful stewards for the abundance of our lives.

Lastly, note that the scripture reading above sums up stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

May God, who is always with us, continue to be our light throughout Advent and into the New Year. God bless you and your loved ones.
